## Who should attend?

- This series is open to all Postdocs, Instructors, Assistant Professors (and equivalent).
- Candidates submitting <u>revised</u> (A1) proposals for the **next K** deadline may attend.
- Please note that the K99 has <u>no US citizenship</u> restriction. Additionally, K99 application must be submitted <u>before</u> reaching your 4-year anniversary (start date) as Postdoc. This is an extremely competitive application. The overall success rate for all NIH Institutes / Centers in 2017 was 23.4%.
- If you are planning to submit a grant proposal within the next 6-9 months you should attend! We have learned from experience (over 160 grants submitted by students in our program) that <u>early planning is</u> <u>a key to success.</u>
- We are happy to have candidates who are planning for any kind of NIH K, VA CDA, or other Career Development or Young Investigator award.

## How to enroll in the course?

- **1.** Biographical sketch following the specific instructions for K Series Career Development Awards
- 2. Title of project (200 characters max., including spaces and punctuation)
- **3.** Your current position at Emory please include your official title, lab, mentor, year postdoc began, or year your current rank began
- 4. Tell me what grant you are applying for: Award category (e.g., K01) and NIH Institute (e.g., NCI)
