

Difficult diseases have met their match.





Many people are interested in participating in research but do not know how to find studies that are right for them. ResearchMatch is a national not-for-profit recruitment registry which brings together researchers and people willing to learn more about research studies (not just clinical trials).

By participating in clinical research, you contribute to improving future health care for everyone.

Who can join?

Anyone from the United States can join ResearchMatch regardless of age, ethnicity or health conditions. Volunteers needing assistance and volunteers under the age of 18 may ask a guardian to register on their behalf. Many studies are looking for healthy people of all ages, while some are looking for people with specific health conditions.

How much does it cost to register?

ResearchMatch is free for everyone.

How long does it take to register?

The online registration takes 5-10 minutes.

I've registered. Now what?

Researchers will search the ResearchMatch database for matches to their studies. If you are a match, you will receive an e-mail from ResearchMatch asking if you want to be contacted by the researcher. You choose if you want to be contacted. It is always your choice!

Is ResearchMatch only for clinical trials?

No, ResearchMatch will help match any type of approved study that is looking for participants. You may be contacted about different research opportunities ranging from a survey you can do at home to a clinical trial that may involve you traveling to the researcher's institution. Some studies provide compensation for time and travel.
