Building Collaborative Research Capacity

Increase community-based organizations' skills and ability to work collaboratively with research partners

Outcomes, Services, and Initiatives

- Funds granted to communitybased organizations
- 34 partnerships and organizations funded, totaling over \$300,000
- Enhanced community assessment, program planning, evaluation, research and grant proposal writing
- Projects including tobacco, cancer, cardiovascular disease, hepatitis, mental health, trauma, breast cancer, and childhood obesity
- 3-Tier system of community engagement support
- Statewide biennial Community Engagement Forum: Advancing Research, Practice, and Population Health
