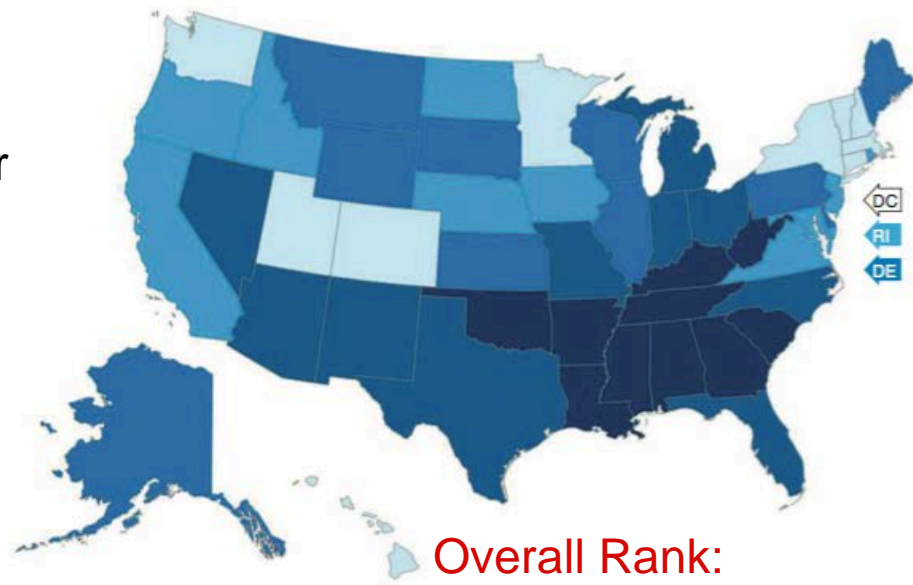
Strengths

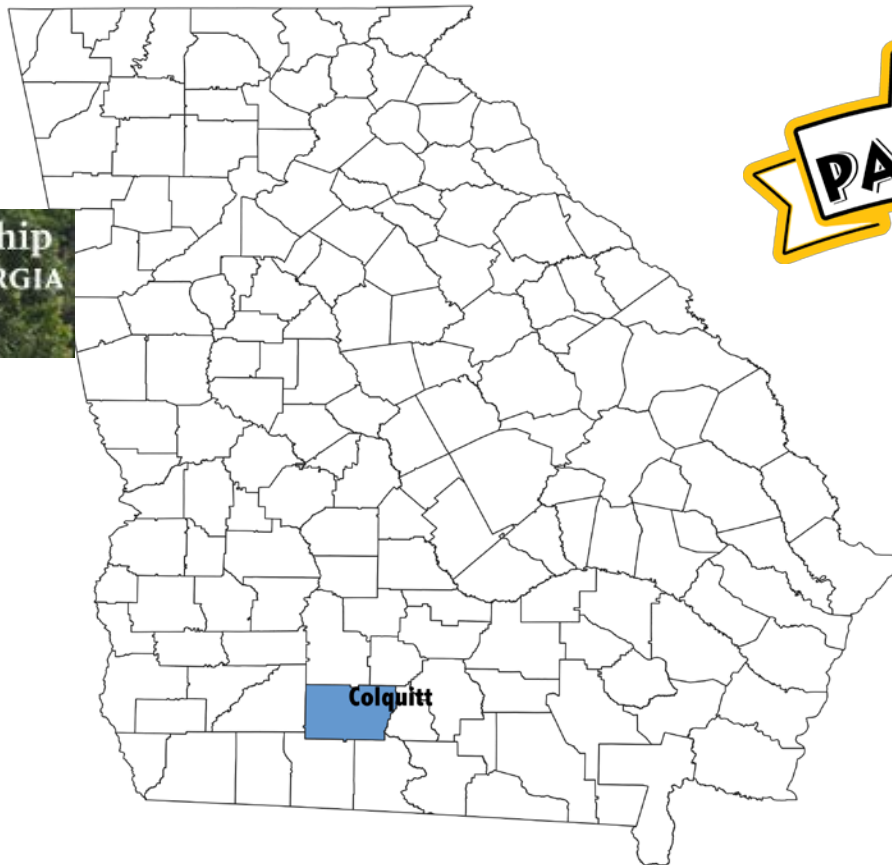




Moving with Data to Action
