



Community Engagement Research Program (CERP)

This program **supports community-university research partnerships, obtains community input into university research, and increases health research in community settings that is responsive to the health needs of the community.** It connects existing academic community research programs from Morehouse School of Medicine and Emory University, **transforms research from a scientist-subject interaction to an equitable partnership, and trains investigators** in principles of community-based participatory research.

- Health Promotion Initiative that relies on community health workers to deliver a health promotion package to community partners
- A two-credit course on *Community Engagement in Clinical Research* and seminars on community-based participatory research
- The Satcher Health Leadership Institute provides training to leaders of community partners to help build capacity in the organizations they represent
- CERP Mini-Grant Program invites proposals for partnership-based health projects that involve collaboration between a community organization and a faculty member
