<u>Location of Position</u>: This position will be through Emory University School of Medicine with office duties carried out at the Woodruff Memorial Building and clinical duties carried out at Emory Clinic A and Emory St. Joseph's Women's Health Center.

## Job Details:

Schedule - Hours: This position is part-time (40-60% FTE). Our team is in need of an RN-level research nurse who can commit to 4-6 half-day blocks weekly (availability in mornings are especially important). During the assigned blocks, the research nurse should be available to attend clinical trial visits at Emory Clinic A or Emory St. Joseph's to perform physical examinations and assessments of patients (women 42-60 years of age experiencing vasomotor symptoms of menopause); when clinical trial patients are not scheduled, the research nurse will be responsible for completing telephone interviews of patients and review of medical records to assess trial eligibility and clinical status.

<u>About the Position</u>: The Emory University School of Medicine Department of Gynecology and Obstetrics (PI = Dr. Anne Dunlop, Site Leads = Drs. Mary Dolan and Sarah Smith) is leading a Phase 2a clinical trial evaluating the safety and efficacy of asimadoline (a non-hormonal medication) for the treatment of vasomotor symptoms of menopause. The <u>licensed RN-level clinical research nurse</u> will be responsible for the following duties:

- Perform physical examination of patients during on-site clinical trial visits at Emory Clinic (Clinic A or St. Joseph's).
- Perform screenings to include review of medical records and telephone interviews of potentially eligible patients to further discern eligibility.
- Communicate results of screening lab studies to enrolled patients.
- Other research duties as assigned.

The ideal clinical research nurse would be a <u>licensed RN</u> with <u>expertise and interest in women's health</u> (especially midlife health, perimenopause and menopause) who is <u>available 4 to 6 half-days per week</u> (especially mornings) that could be 'blocked' out to be devoted to the above duties (such that participants who are pre-screened by the clinical research coordinators could be scheduled for phone interviews and examinations by the clinician one to three weeks in advance).
