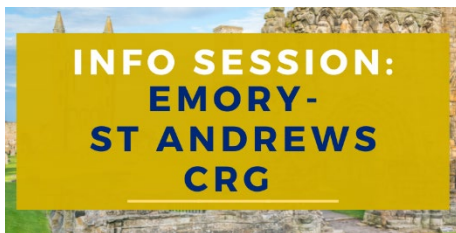
UPCOMING EVENTS

Global Perspectives on Race+, Ethnicity+, and Nation+

These grants support research that examines race, ethnicity, and nationality as broadly conceived in any country outside the United States. Projects might include, but are not limited to, the interplay of race, ethnicity, and/or nationality on inequalities/inequities and the egalitarian movements they foster; imperialism and colonialism; ethnic conflict; community coalition building, and race, ethnicity, and/or nationality with gender, sexuality, religion, education, labor, science, art, and/or health.



Collaborative Research Grants

These grants primarily support mobility for innovative collaborative research projects between Emory faculty and faculty from our partner universities. The research may be in any field or discipline and take place in any country or region as long as it is done collaboratively.



Oxford-Halle Global Research Scholars Program

These grants, in any of the following six URC categories, are for individual or collaborative research with an international dimension: visual & performing arts, biological and health sciences, humanities, interdisciplinary, math and natural sciences, and social sciences.



URC-Halle Institute Global Research Award

These grants, in any of the following six URC categories, are for individual or collaborative research with an international dimension: visual & performing arts, biological and health sciences, humanities, interdisciplinary, math and natural sciences, and social sciences.
