In partnership with the Morehouse School of Medicine (MSM), Emory University's PREHS-SEED mentored K12 career development program is open to applicants meeting the criteria below:

- Junior clinical faculty from Emory School of Nursing, Emory School of Medicine, or Morehouse School of Medicine
- Focus on pediatric and reproductive research with an environmental health focus

Scholar award includes:

- Individual didactic and mentored research training in pediatric and reproductive environmental health research
- Up to 2 years of salary support and funding for research to assess environmental health exposures and disparities to improve health equity and safeguard the health of at-risk women and children in the Southeastern United States.
- Support for career development to transition to independent research careers through advanced support mechanisms, e.g., NIH-funded K08 and K23 grant awards.
