

Overview of the Program

The Translational GI/Hepatology research training program seeks to recruit and train highly qualified and motivated postdoctoral fellows in Translational Gastroenterology and Hepatology. The training program will emphasize working at the interface between basic biology and translational medicine to fill important gaps in knowledge and therapeutics. The program is expanding to include precision GI and hepatology medicine through risk prediction, therapeutic drug positioning through multiomics, artificial intelligence and machine learning.

Inter-related Translational Themes & Mentor Groups



Trainees will develop expertise as digestive health researchers under the oversight and guidance of the Executive Committee, choosing **from 16 mentors** in Pediatrics, Medicine, Biochemistry, Pathology, and Biomedical engineering. The training program incorporates a structured degree program in Masters of Science in Clinical Research or a Certificate in Translational Research, via the Laney Graduate School/Georgia Clinical & Translational Science Alliance (Georgia CTSA).

Requirements

Postdoctoral candidate must have completed a PhD, MD, MD/PhD degree. Applicants must be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States at the time of their appointment.
