The Georgia CTSA (NIH-supported Clinical and Translational Science Award) **T32 (formerly TL1) Program** is focused on providing *innovative didactic and mentored clinical and translational research (CTR) training* to individuals interested in careers that encompass CTR and clinical and translational science (CTS). The Georgia CTSA T32 Program supports **predoctoral** and **postdoctoral trainees** from one of the four Georgia CTSA institutions: Emory University, Georgia Tech, Morehouse School of Medicine, or University of Georgia. Per NIH requirements, T32 applicants must be U.S. Citizens or Permanent Residents. For additional eligibility requirements, visit the Georgia CTSA T32 website.

Predoctoral T32 program eligibility:

- **Medical or PharmD students:** Medical students at Emory or Morehouse School of Medicine (MSM) and PharmD students at UGA are eligible for T32 support as part of a dual degree track (MD/MSCR or PharmD/MSCR).
- **PhD graduate students:** PhD graduate students may apply for T32 support after completing their institution's qualifying examinations or equivalent and advancing to PhD candidacy.

Postdoctoral T32 program eligibility:

- **PhD Postdoctoral Trainees:** Postdoctoral fellows at the four Georgia CTSA institutions who, per NIH requirements, **are within two years of their terminal degree** at the time of their appointment to the Georgia CTSA T32 Program.
- **Physicians and PharmDs in Training (residents and fellows):** Physicians and PharmDs in residency or fellowship training programs at the Emory University School of Medicine, Morehouse School of Medicine, or the University of Georgia are eligible to apply. The two-year limit on time since terminal degree does **NOT** apply to physicians and PharmDs.
- Postdoctoral fellowships may **NOT** be contingent upon receiving the Georgia CTSA T32 award.
- Postdoctoral applicants **must be employed** and on payroll at their institution at the time of appointment.

Applicants accepted into the T32 Program receive the following support:

- NIH NRSA Stipend, Tuition, Travel funds (\$1,500), Training-Related Expenses (TRE), and up to \$3,000 in Childcare expenses.
